

MEXICO: Oaxaca Valley

We spent four nights in beautiful Oaxaca City, nestled in a valley in the foothills of the Sierra Madre. We were based in a lovely hotel that served delicious local food and had a gorgeous garden that featured birds like Gray Silky-Flycatcher, White-throated Towhee, and Berylline Hummingbird. Each morning we set out early to bird in one of the many great birding spots that surround the city. The rainy season had come and the normally dry countryside had greened up considerably.

The first morning we headed up the mountains into the higher elevation pine-oak forest. Here we found the Oaxacan endemic Dwarf Jay--the bird that particular area is most famous for-moving with a flock of Gray-barred Wrens, along with Red Warbler, a spectacular bird found only in Mexican highlands. We were also excited to find a Oaxacan Arboreal Alligator Lizard here. The second morning we visited scrubby fields and valleys east of the city. This is where we found birds like Boucard's Wren, Dusky Hummingbird, Bridled Sparrow, and Blue Mockingbird. For the third morning, we headed east again, this time to a lower elevation dry forest habitat. The stunning Orange-breasted Bunting put on a great show, along with Green-fronted Hummingbird, Russet-crowned Motmot, Ferruginous Pygmy-Owl, and a good diversity of butterflies. Our final morning was spent at Monte Alban, both seeing the ruins and seeing birds in the area, including Orange-billed Nightingale-Thrush and Pileated Flycatcher.

In between birding, we managed to fit in some culture, learning about the local textile industry, visiting the historic city center, and walking around the pre-Colombia ruins of Monte Albán. And we ate a lot of mole!

- 4. (tie) Green-crowned Hummingbird, Blue Mockingbird, Black-vented Oriole, Cinnamon-rumped Seedeater, Gray Silky-Flycatcher, Blue-throated Mountain-Gem, and Crested Caracara
