I love Cape May in early October. Not only is the birding fantastic, but Monarchs sometimes steal the show. We saw lots of great birds this trip, yes, but watching thousands of Monarchs waking up after roosting in the Cape May Dunes, taking off as the sun warmed the fall air and setting off across Delaware Bay, was an experience that will stay with us forever.

But that was just the first morning of the trip. In our remaining time, we visited some of the country's most fabled birding hotspots, place like Cape May Point State Park and its hawkwatch platform, Higbee Beach, South Cape May Meadows, and Forsythe National Wildlife Refuge. Our lodging was within a stone's throw of those spots.

We had beautiful weather, warm enough that we were able to eat all of our meals outside. We also had good weather for raptor migration, getting repeated great views of birds like Merlin, Northern Harrier, Sharp-shinned Hawk, Broad-winged Hawk, and Osprey. We also had tremendous coastal birding, getting great views of a variety of shorebirds, gulls, and terns, plus Black Skimmer, Tricolored Heron, Clapper Rail, and Seaside and Saltmarsh Sparrows. Cape May always holds a few surprises, too--on this trip those included Eurasian Wigeon, Common Raven, Wilson's Phalarope, and Golden-winged Warbler.
