The area around Savanna, Illinois, along the Mississippi River in the northwestern part of the state, makes for a great birding weekend. High quality bluff forests and top-notch grasslands situated along the Mighty Mississippi means there is exception bird diversity in a small area, and many of the birds are highly sought by local birders. On this trip we saw most of those regional specialties, birds like Loggerhead Shrike, Whip-poor-will, Cerulean, Yellow-throated, Prothonotary, and Kentucky Warblers, Blue Grosbeak, Western Meadowlark, Lark, Vesper, and Grasshopper Sparrows, Acadian Flycatcher, Summer and Scarlet Tanagers, and more. Although migration wasn't super active, we did see many migrating Common Nighthawks, a smattering of migrating warblers, and Common Terns along the river.
